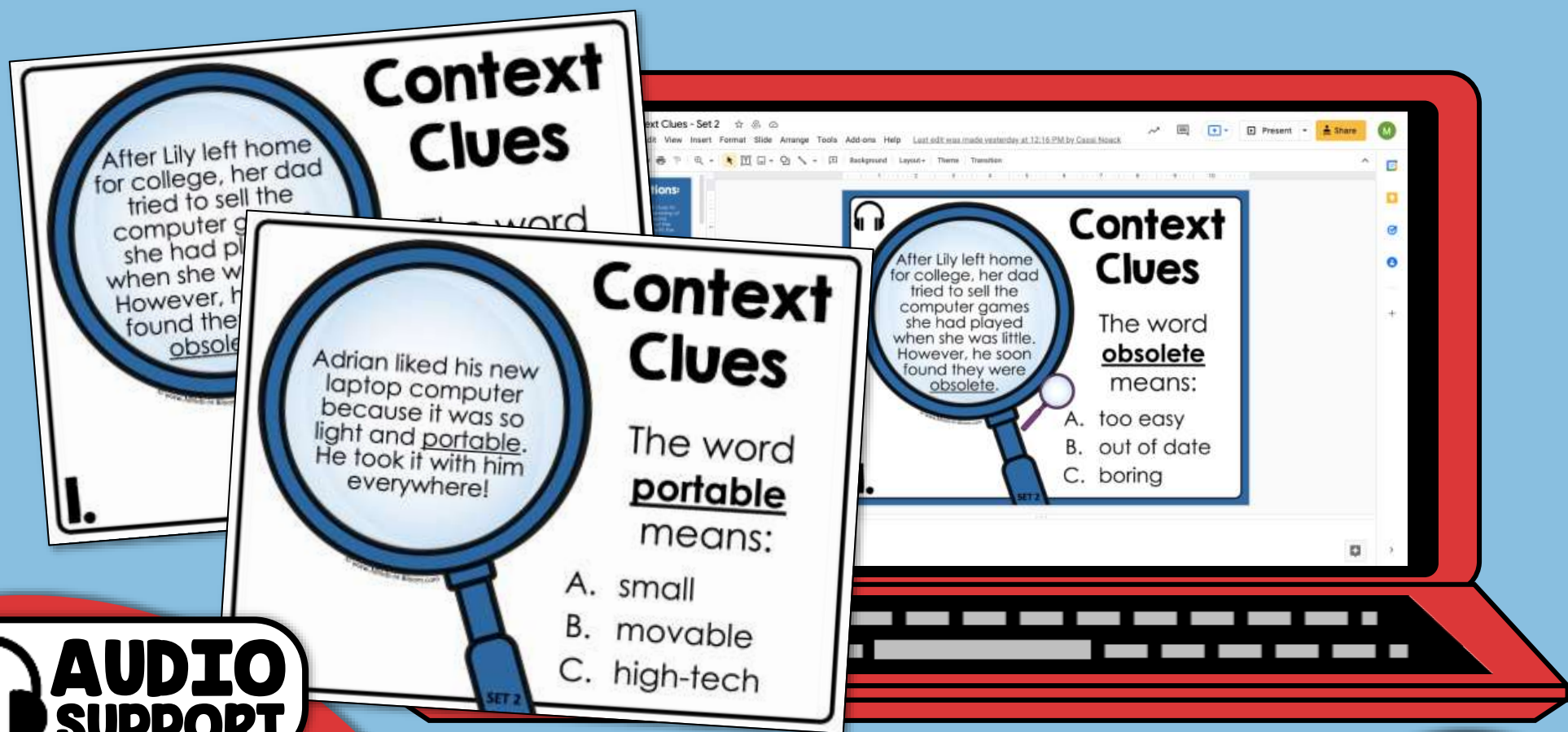

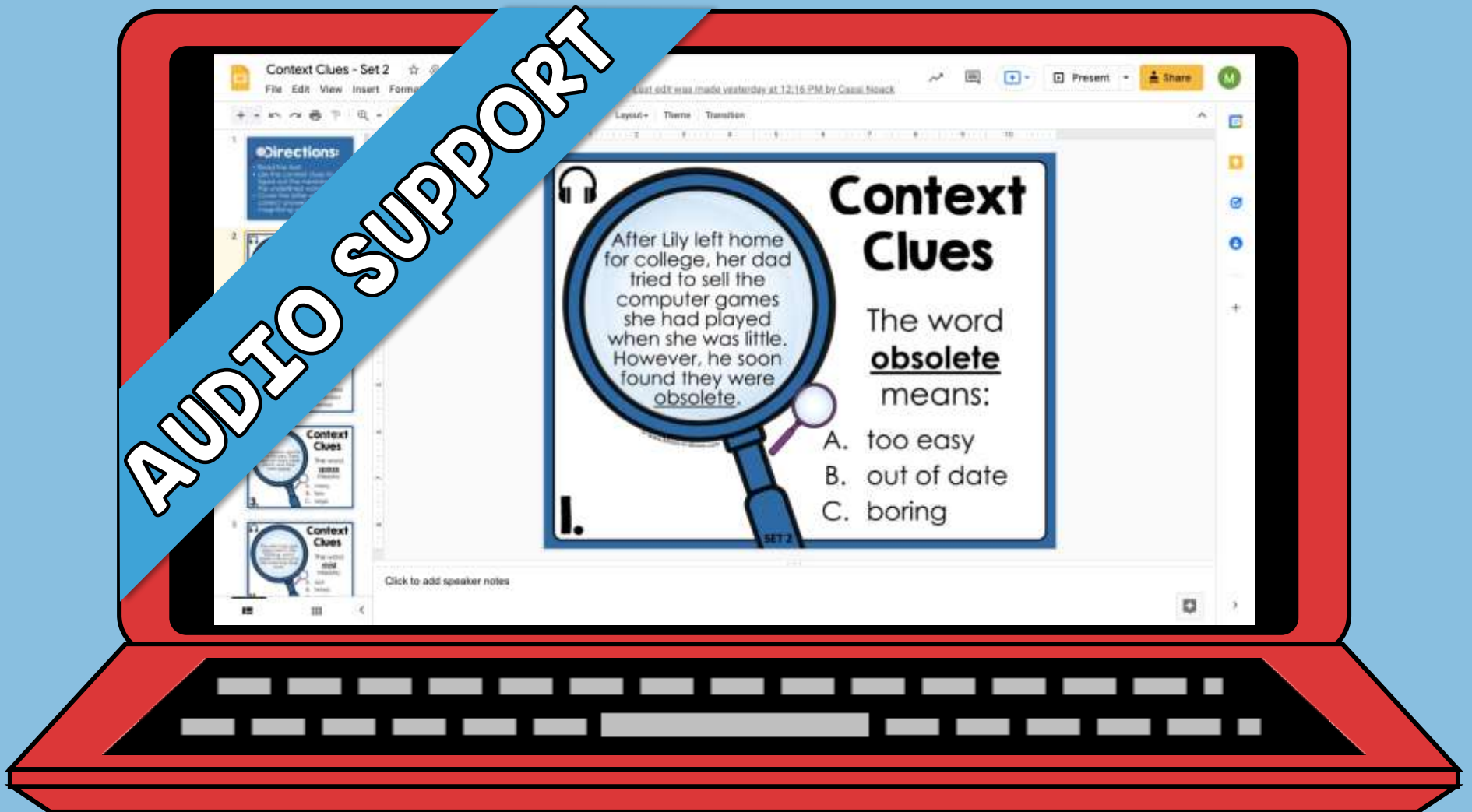

## Definition or Restatement

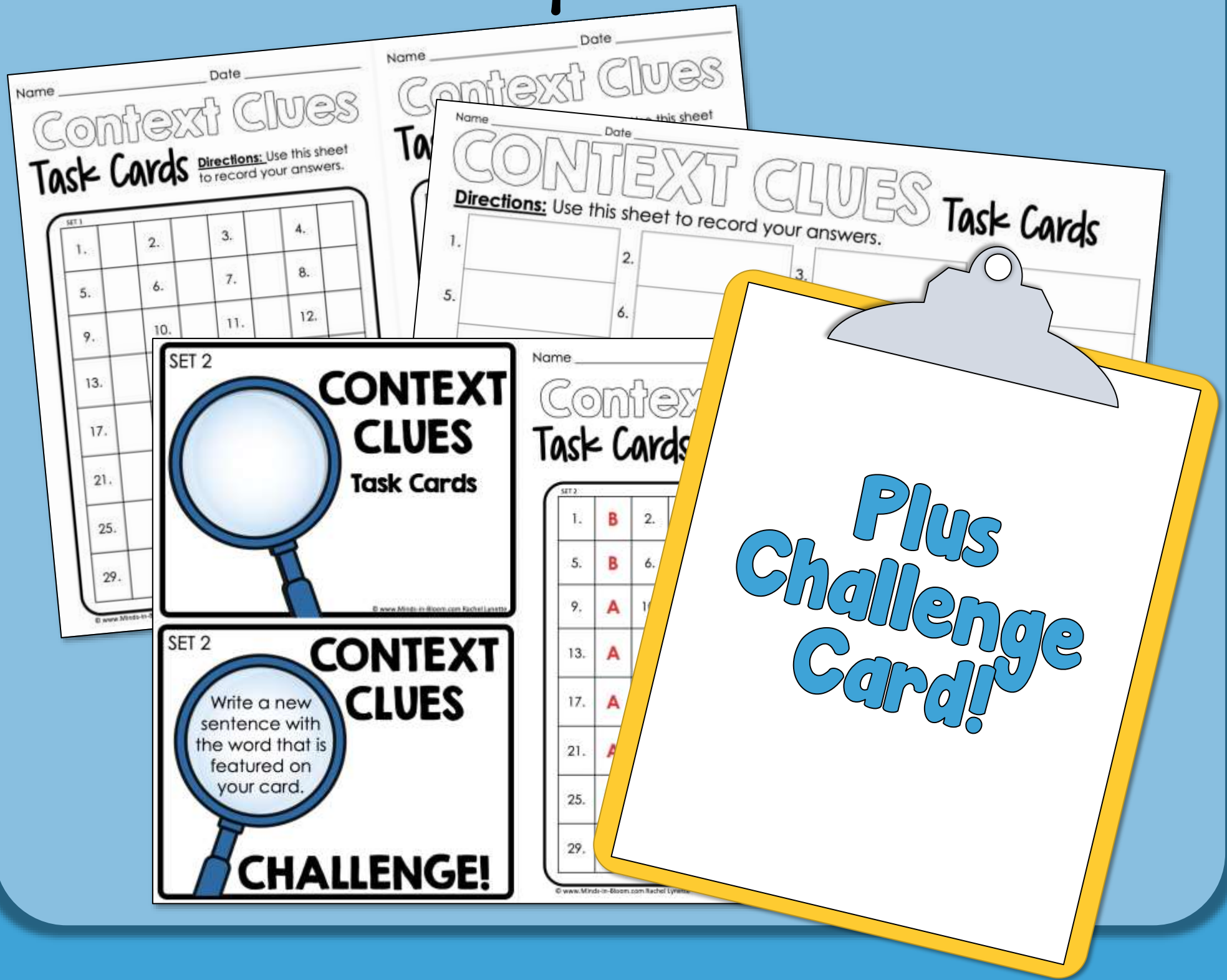

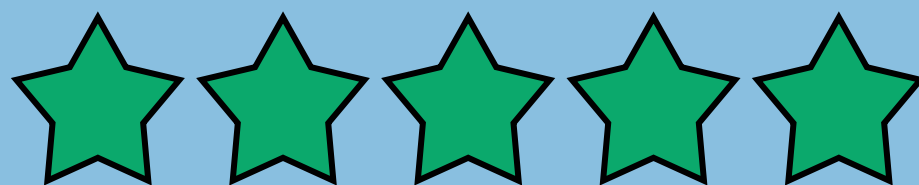
