LOVE this resource! We put these in our hallway next to our informational texts and the students love them!

Each student gets a packet of these cards, cuts them up, and places them in a plastic bag that is attached to his/her reading log. Students choose one of these (or others from a fiction pack) and respond to the text he/she is reading that day. This will give my students many opportunities to write.

These are awesome! I love that there are so many. I've been using spinners and comprehension dice with my kids, but these cards are way more versatile.

I love using these in my read-to-self station. Students can respond to one daily or one at the end of the book they are reading, whatever the teacher prefers. This holds them accountable for reading and allows them an opportunity to practice read to respond and deep thinking questions about the text.
