



Vampire Bats

Vampire bats got their scary name because they live off blood from other animals. Vampire bats are the only mammals that must drink blood to live.

Although there are more than 1,200 kinds of bats, only three kinds are vampire bats. The white-winged and the hairy-legged vampire bats feed on birds. The common vampire bat feasts on larger mammals such as cows, pigs, and horses. Vampire bats almost never try to feed on human blood.

Vampire bats feed on just one animal each night. They cannot go more than two days without a meal. Sometimes a female bat will throw up blood. Then she shares the blood with another bat in the colony that has not gotten enough to eat.
